Lesson Plan: "THE TALE OF MR. FIXIT & THE MOST IMPORTANT TOOL"

Grade Level: 2nd Grade

Objective: Students will explore the themes of kindness, friendship, and understanding differences through the story, engaging in activities to deepen their connection to these themes.

Materials:

- Copy of "THE TALE OF MR. FIXIT & THE MOST IMPORTANT TOOL"
- Drawing paper and coloring materials
- Chart paper or whiteboard and markers
- "Kindness Hearts" Heart-shaped cutouts
- Handouts for activities

Duration: 3 days (60 minutes per day)

Day 1: Introduction and Kindness

- 1. Read-Aloud (15 minutes)
 - Read the first chapter of the book and discuss the characters.
- 2. Kindness Discussion (15 minutes)
 - Discuss kindness using examples from the book.
 - Ask students to share examples of kindness in their lives.
- 3. Kindness Hearts Activity (20 minutes)
 - Distribute heart cutouts for students to write or draw acts of kindness.
 - Create a kindness display in the classroom.
- 4. Homework Assignment (10 minutes)
 - Assign reading for the next day (up to Chapter 2).

Day 2: Friendship and Understanding Differences

- 1. Reading Discussion (15 minutes)
 - Review the assigned reading and discuss friendship.
- 2. Friendship Activity (15 minutes)

- Students draw a picture of themselves with a friend and describe what makes a good friend.
- 3. Introduction to Understanding Differences (20 minutes)
 - Briefly discuss the concept of autism and what makes us unique.
 - Create a class mural with drawings of what makes each student special.
- 4. Reflection (10 minutes)
 - Reflect on the importance of accepting and celebrating differences.

Day 3: Building Character and Culminating Activities

- 1. Character Building Discussion (15 minutes)
 - Discuss the actions and growth of the characters in the book.
- 2. Role-Playing Activity (15 minutes)
 - Have students act out scenes from the book focusing on kindness and friendship.
- 3. Craft Activity: Making Friendship Bracelets (20 minutes)
 - Guide students in making friendship bracelets to give to a classmate.
- 4. Closing Circle (10 minutes)
- Gather students for a closing circle to share what they learned about kindness, friendship, and understanding differences.

Assessment: Observe student participation, understanding of themes, completion of activities, and reflection during the closing circle.

Extensions and Modifications:

- For more advanced students, include writing activities.
- For students needing extra support, provide additional guidance during activities.
